



San Francisco Department of Public Health Healthy Development Measurement Tool (HDMT) Training Announcement – February 4, 2009

What is the Healthy Development Measurement Tool?

The Healthy Development Measurement Tool is a comprehensive evaluation metric to consider health needs in land use development plans and projects. SFPDPH developed the HDMT in 2007 and maintains it as a publicly accessible website at www.TheHDMT.org. The HDMT is comprised of:

- Twenty-seven objectives that, if achieved, would result in greater and more equitable health assets and resources for San Francisco residents
- Over 120 indicators and data for San Francisco neighborhoods that describe baseline conditions and help evaluate progress towards the objectives
- Targets for urban development projects and plans that, if achieved, would improve baseline conditions
- Policies and design strategies that help development plans and projects achieve the development targets

What are the training objectives?

- Provide an introduction to the HDMT and website
- Demonstrate how HDMT indicators and data can be used
- Illustrate how HDMT development targets can be applied to land use projects
- Help consider the ways that the HDMT framework and content is relevant to your work
